MA Seminar: Coaching for Academic Work (6 ECTS)

In a **two-day workshop** (week before the start of the semester), you will acquire the skills to teach the basics of scientific work and learn what is important when coaching and organizing groups.

You will then take over **two tutorials per week** of the bachelor's lecture "Introduction to Scientific Work" (which will be redesigned). You will be introducing bachelor's students to the various topics of scientific work, such as quantitative and qualitative research methods, the use and handling of AI, as well as questions of scientific ethics and philosophy. You will be able to apply the knowledge acquired during the workshop directly in practice.

In addition to leading the exercise groups, the acquisition of the 6 ECTS credits includes the supervision of e-learning activities, the correction of practical exercises, the answering of students' questions, as well as the support of the lecturers in organizational aspects of the management of several groups.

You have:

- a flair for guiding groups of students in the context of exercises
- Interest in scientific work
- Interest in and good basic knowledge of quantitative research methods
- Interest in questions of philosophy and ethics of science
- a self-reliant, reliable, and motivating personality and can imagine passing on your knowledge and experience from your studies to the new students
- Enjoyment of being part of a young and dynamic team and willingness to self-reflect

Compensation:

6 ECTS credits

Bachelor's students who have successfully completed the assessment level and compulsory modules of the bachelor's level can also apply. Please note that the ECTS can only be used for a master's degree according to the credits in the course catalogue and that a maximum of 30 ECTS of the master's level can be brought forward.
